ST. CHARLES PUBLIC LIBRARY EXAM CRAM



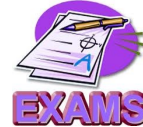

AUTO CLUB



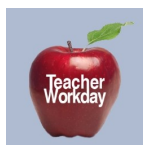
