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Community

Community Unit School District 303 is a high-achieving, pre-K-12 system covering 57.4 square miles in the picturesque Fox River Valley, 40 miles west of Chicago. District 303 serves approximately 12,500 students from the City of St. Charles and portions of West Chicago, South Elgin, Wayne, Campton Hills, Wasco, Elburn and unincorporated Kane County. In July 2011, Family Circle Magazine named St. Charles the “Best Town for Families” in the United States. Among the reasons why the City of St. Charles was given this honor is the involvement of District 303 in the community. District 303 works closely with the City of St. Charles, the St. Charles Park District, the St. Charles Public Library and other civic organizations to benefit the residents of the community.

School

St. Charles East is the older of two, four-year senior high schools in District 303. Fall, 2016 enrollment at East was 2540 with 601 seniors in the Class of 2017. 67.4% of the graduates matriculated into 141 four-year colleges, 25% chose a two-year college, and 8% pursued other opportunities. East is a member of the College Board and IACAC. The operating expense per pupil in 2016-17 was \$13,104.

Organization of the School Year

The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The day is divided into eight 47-minute periods. The first semester ends on January 18, 2018, and the second semester ends on June 4, 2018.

Faculty

Of the 195 certified faculty members, 150 hold Masters Degrees and 4 hold Doctorates. 24 teachers are Nationally Board Certified. The faculty have an average of 12 years of teaching experience.

Student Services

A comprehensive program of student services is provided. Seven professionals assist students with personal and academic concerns, college selections, and career/vocational plans. Complementing the counselors are social workers, school psychologists, student services specialists, student assistance coordinator, deans, and nurses.

East students are highly involved in school activities. There is an extremely rich tradition in athletics with 30 sports available to men and women.
